HIV is a virus that attacks and weakens the immune system. Without a strong immune system, the body has trouble



AIDS is an advanced stage in HIV infection. AIDS is when someone with HIV has lost most of their immune cells and will be experiencing health complications from opportunistic infections like pneumonia that can cause people to become ill and die.

Barriers created by social determinants of health mean some people are not getting the care they need. This is where Casey House comes in.



Treatment

Only 66% of people with HIV in Ontario are on treatment and not all are 100% adherent.

On the flipside, 34% of people with HIV in Ontario are NOT on any treatment.

In 1988, when Casey House was founded by a tenacious group of visionary volunteers, the disease was stigmatized and fear ran deep.

Today, Casey House remains one of the few places where people with HIV/AIDS know they can come to receive compassionate care without judgment. Our clients need a safe place to help them access the treatment they need. On a given week at Casey House, 85% of inpatient clients have AIDS.
